The Apprentice X Pre-Apprenticeship program will provide a potential pipeline to The Apprentice School program with Newport News Shipbuilding or any maritime or career pathway. Accepted high school junior and senior pre-apprentices will participate in dual enrollment classes taught virtually by apprentice school faculty. Pre-apprentices will take part in work-based learning experiences while earning high school and transferrable credit.

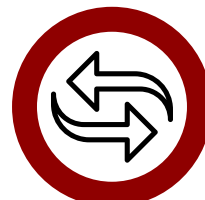

SUMMER BEFORE

All listed courses are a part of the World Class Shipbuilder Curriculum (WCSC). If a pre-apprentice participating in Apprentice X applies in the spring semester of their senior year to The Apprentice School and is hired, they will have already completed multiple academic classes toward their apprenticeship!



Apprentice X is in discussion with Virginia Peninsula Community College (formerly Thomas Nelson Community College) regarding accepting the following WCSC transfer credits: DRFT 111, PHYS 221, PHYS 222, MATH 111, MATH 112, BUSI 222.

OPPORTUNITIES AFTER APPRENTICE X

Apply to Apprentice X

Dual enrollment classes earn students high school credits while taking World Class Shipbuilder Curriculum (WCSC) academic courses via distance learning.

Apply to The Apprentice School

Once hired, apprentices will finish (WCSC) while completing on-the-job training on the waterfront. Our apprenticeship requires the completion of (WCSC) academic courses and 7,000 hours of on-the-job training minimum.

Earn Certificate in Maritime Studies

With the completion of (WCSC) academic courses, apprentices will earn their certificate and continue on-the-job training toward their required hours.

Continue in Apprenticeship

The apprenticeship includes multiple craft rotations to develop the knowledge and skills required to complete the state registered apprenticeship. Apprentices will continue working toward their required hours and complete their Associate of Applied Science degree.

Apprenticeship Options

- 4 year standard apprenticeship
- 5 year advanced apprenticeship
 - After 2 years of the standard option, on a competitive basis eligibility for the 5 year advanced option becomes available
- 8 year advanced apprenticeship
 - After 5 years of the advanced option, on a competitive basis eligibility for the 8 year advanced option becomes available which includes course work for the Bachelor of Science in Engineering from Old Dominion University.

The Apprentice School Graduation

Apprentice graduates are fully employed, highly skilled, well paid men and women who are technically competent for careers in shipbuilding.

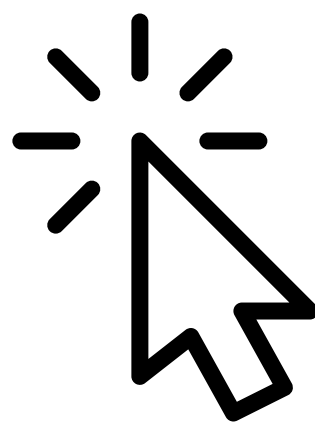
